OUR CHURCH

Mosaic Ministries Association is a registered Christian charity based in Halifax, Nova Scotia; operating out of 28 Willett Street in the Fairview neighbourhood. Originally known as Alive Christian Church, founded in 1981; it was joined by another congregation in 2012 and under a new leader became Mosaic Church. Mosaic is a multi-cultural church that reflects the diversity of our community. Mosaic members come from Halifax, Uganda, Congo, Kenya, Nigeria, Jamaica, Colombia, Zimbabwe, Iraq, China and Zambia.

Key services and operations of the charity include:

- Community Outreach: Contributing to local ecumenical food banks and involvement in community activities.
- Pastoral & Youth Services: Hosting weekly prayer meetings, Bible studies, and Sunday School programs.
- Global Missions: Providing financial support to Open Heavens Ministries in Cuba and recently added International Global Response Ministries Inc.

Mosaic is seeking a Spirit-led lead pastor with deep integrity. They must be genuinely sensitive to people of all cultures and generations. They will bring Spirit-guided Biblical preaching and teaching, a gift for equipping others for ministry, and strength in pastoral counselling and mentoring. OUR COMMUNITY

Fairview

Fairview is named after Fairview Cove, which forms the extreme southern end of Bedford Basin at the northern edge of the isthmus connecting the Halifax Peninsula with the larger Chebucto peninsula. The Dutch Village was one of the original homes of the Foreign Protestants that arrived in Halifax in the 1750s.

Fairview, an older well-established community sits next door to Clayton Park. Clayton Park is one of the newer areas in Halifax, which has been characterized by significant development over the past 20 years.

Fairview, known for an abundance of apartments and as a lower economic area; is growing with new high rise residential at the site of the previous Halifax West High School, along with new semi-detached homes here and there and many homes seeing renovations. Many young families are moving into the area due to the easy commute to the peninsula.

What is nearby

Fairview is a highly central Halifax neighbourhood offering quick access to major retail, dining, and recreation hubs. Its prime location is only minutes away from the city's largest shopping destinations and scenic outdoor spots.

Recreation & Outdoors

● Mainland North Common & Canada Games Centre: Located in neighbouring Clayton Park, this centre features a fitness facility, pools, and walking tracks.

● Bedford Basin: Fairview hugs the Bedford Basin, an area of scenic coastal walking trails, the Ashburn Golf Club, and parks.

Shopping

Halifax Shopping Centre - located on Mumford Road just a few minutes away, this is the largest enclosed mall in Atlantic Canada, featuring major retailers like Simon's and Zara.

Bayers Lake Business Park - a quick 5-to-10-minute drive down the road, you will find this sprawling commercial hub featuring big-box stores like Walmart, Winners, and restaurants like Moxies.

Historic Sites nearby

Halifax Public Gardens - Victorian-era public gardens formally established in 1867, the year of Canadian Confederation. The gardens are located on the Halifax Peninsula near the popular shopping district of Spring Garden Road and opposite Victoria Park.

Due to Fairview's central location, several of Halifax's most prominent military, cultural, and architectural landmarks are a short drive away.

Halifax Citadel National Historic Site - located on the prominent hill overlooking downtown. This star-shaped fortress features historical re-enactments, tunnels, muzzle-loading guns, and a daily noon-cannon blast.

Africville National Historic Site - positioned just north of the peninsula. This park and museum commemorate a historic African Nova Scotian community that was forcibly displaced in the 1960s.

The Old Town Clock - designed by Prince Edward, Duke of Kent. This iconic 1803 clock structure rests on the slopes of Citadel Hill and has kept time for the city for over two centuries.

The Historic Properties - a beautiful, walkable area of rejuvenated waterfront warehouses dating back to the Napoleonic Wars; now filled with local boutiques and dining spots.

Outside Halifax

Heading outside the Halifax urban core opens up to a diverse selection of Nova Scotia's most famous coastal villages, UNESCO heritage towns, and scenic natural parks.

Peggy's Cove - a picturesque fishing village under an hour's drive from Halifax, renowned for the iconic Peggy's Point Lighthouse resting on massive, wave-washed granite rocks.

Old Town Lunenburg - a vibrant waterfront town established in 1753 and designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site for being the best surviving example of a planned British colonial settlement in North America.

Grand-Pré National Historic Site - a serene park and monument to Acadian culture, detailing the history of 18th-century French settlers and their tragic mass deportation by British forces.

Parrsboro - located along the Bay of Fundy, this area is a global hotspot for prehistoric fossil discoveries embedded within towering sea cliffs. It has received the "Cliffs of Fundy UNESCO Global Geopark" designation.

Required Skills

- Hold or be eligible for credentials with the Pentecostal Assemblies of Canada
- Demonstrate a deep love for Scripture and a commitment to preaching and teaching God's Word with clarity, accuracy, and practical application
- Meet Biblical qualifications 1Tim 3, Titus 1, 1 Peter 5
- Possess strong skills in Pastoral care and counselling
- The ability to equip and raise leaders within the congregation
- Lead the church in a clear, intentional discipleship strategy that helps people grow from new believers to mature followers of Christ
- Conflict resolution

Required Education

- Possess formal theological training (minimum Bachelor's Degree or equivalent)
- Ordained by and in good standing with the Pentecostal Assemblies of Canada

Required Experience

- Have prior pastoral ministry experience (minimum 1-2 previous positions as lead pastor)
- Demonstrates strong biblical preaching and teaching
